Rules & Regulations

1. General Compliance

- All exhibitors must comply with the Needville Youth Fair General Rules.
- Cedar Shaving only

2. Tag-In Requirements

- Heifers must be officially entered and tagged on Saturday, January 10, 2026, from 7:30 9:00 a.m.
- Family tagging is allowed per General Rule 9.

3. Eligibility

- Show-eligible heifers must be born between May 1, 2024, and April 30, 2025.
- Heifers born between May 1 and August 31, 2024, must be safe in calf and certified by a veterinarian within 30 days of check-in.
- A pregnancy check is required in order to sell a heifer 'as bred' and must be certified by a veterinarian within 30 days of check-in.

4. Check-In

- Each exhibitor may bring only one (1) heifer to official check-in.
- All heifers will be photographed at tag-in.

• Heifers must have a permanent brucellosis tag in place and a vaccination record on file.

5. Grooming & Show Preparation

- The NYF heifer show is a 'blow and go' show.
- Heifers must be presented in natural conformation and condition.
- No adhesives, glues, paints, foams, hairspray, colorings, or foreign materials that alter appearance are permitted.

6. Class Divisions & Sale

- Heifers will be divided into classes after check-in for judging purposes.
- Twenty (20) heifers will qualify for the sale; Grand and Reserve Champions must sell.
- Exhibitors who wish to retain ownership may elect not to sell to allow other exhibitors to participate.
- All sale heifers must return Friday, May 1, 2026, by 6:00 p.m. to the designated area for heifers.

7. Buyer Restrictions

 Auction buyers shall not be approached by anyone to buy back or be asked to donate their animal back to the exhibitor.

8. Animal Containment

- Animals may not be removed from the fenced area for any reason once they have been checked in.
- Heifers must be secured with a neck rope while in the stall area.

9. Exhibitor Responsibilities

- Exhibitors must manage and control their heifers upon arrival, during showing, and through the auction.
- Heifers must walk through the auction portion of the show; failure to do so will result in a non-sale classification.
- Any heifer that cannot be safely controlled will be excused and sent home.

10. Final Authority

All decisions made by the Division Chairman and/or Vice Chairman are final.
